along Czacki & Ledochowski Streets, near SS. Cyril & Methodius Church, platted 1883 (English translation-Bright Mountain)

Byrnesville

east of Rt. 83 near Bluff Road

Carrols Corner

near Sag Bridge Cemetery at Archer Ave.

Center Cass

combined with Lace to create Darien

Corktown

south of Sag, east of Des Plaines

Des Plaines

west of Sag Bridge (section 11) platted 1837

Emmetsburg

west of present day Lemont (section 30) platted in 1839

Goodings Grove

(aka Puckerville) 143<sup>rd</sup> St. and Bell Road

Harmonsville	Main St. and Archer Ave. (sections 13 & 14) platted in 1837

Hastings	Main St. and Walker Road (section 22)
Haytown	west of State St. on Main St. (section 20)
Hazel Dell	McCarthy Road area
Keepataw / Keepotaw	original covered about 320 acres, platted in 1836; later small area west of State St. along Des Plaines River was platted in 1839 (section 20)
Lace	75 <sup>th</sup> St. between Cass Ave. & Clarendon Hills Road, combined with Center Cass to create Darien
Lambert	Main St. and Archer Ave. (sections 13 & 14) developed in 1838
Lower Cass	Argonne property
Palisades	east of Rt. 83 just north of Des Plaines River
Palmyra	name for Lemont, main town & township for one month April-May 1850
Peterson Park	west of Warner Ave. between Logan St and Cass St established in 1905 (entrance on Cass St., Park backed up to Brown estate)
Puckerville	(aka Goodings Grove) 143 <sup>rd</sup> St. & Bell Rd.
Recreation "Bowl"	behind "old Central School" on McCarthy
Sag Bridge	Main St. and Archer Ave. (sections 13 & 14) Started as a village in 1838

Smokey Row	Downtown along N'East side of I & M Canal in 1890; later (abt. 1895) included north Stephen St., River Rd., Canal St., Main St., and "the Flats", the land between I&M Canal & Santa Fe RR tracks
Toddle Grove	State Street south of 127 <sup>th</sup> Street
Truesdell	along Canal St., downtown Lemont
Upper Cass	combined with Lace to create Darien
Woodland Park	Edwin Walker estate circa 1860's Main Street (near Walker Road)
