

GENEALOGY CORNER

Genealogy: Not Just For People By Barb Bannon

The terms Genealogy & Family History Tree are often used interchangeably when speaking about researching ancestors. The idea of a tree goes beyond just tracking great-great-grandpa. One definition of Genealogy from Merriam-Webster is "an account of the origin and historical development of something," "the study of ancestral lines," or "pedigree."

Knowing the pedigree of a thoroughbred horse is very important to horse breeders when making the decision to purchase a young horse. The same goes for any dog breeder producing prospective show animals. Visual identification of a breed is only 25% accurate even when made by professionals. They need to do their homework.

Do you have an interest in music? Which came first: Rockabilly or Bubble Gum? Is your favorite music Pop, Rock, Jazz, Blues, or Country? There are websites dedicated to the developmental history of specific genres. Some websites have even used the family tree ancestral chart to show a particular lineage.

Are you always working on a classic car? Research which car maker owned which car brands or where a particular brand came from and how the corporate giants of today were developed. Learn what startups didn't make it along the way and which companies that did last weren't even car companies when they began their life.

There are genealogy sites for other interests; some trace the development of languages, sports, the history of time zones, and even one where you can keep track of the Descendants of Chaos at "Greek Gods Family Tree" in case it's all Greek to you.

Many interests are researched in much the same way as ancestors for a family tree. There are different degrees of genealogy, and we can determine how far in to the gene pool we want to dive. The tools we have available now make it easy to do research anywhere at any time, from just our phone. We just have to utter the words "Alexa, who", "Google, when...." or "Siri, where..." to get started with genealogy research.

Genealogy is easier than ever, it's not just for researching ancestors, and it's certainly not just for Grandma anymore!

Genealogists are time travelers; a great genealogist is a time unraveler.

May Hike in Waterfall Glen Forest Preserve

It was 8 am on a brisk spring morning as eager hikers gathered for a trek through Waterfall Glen. The group included some newcomers to the area from Schaumburg and some former Lemonters who moved to Kankakee when the village got *too big*. The walk took them through Poverty Prairie, the remains of the Lincoln Park Nursery, and the Lemont Lookout that offers a beautiful view of the valley.



Many of the hikers inquired about future hikes, especially around the quarries. Richard told them we would try to have one or more each month through seasonable weather, and he directed them to our Facebook

page where they had initially learned about the event. We plan on having another hike in June to *Old Signal Hill* in Waterfall Glen.

Richard introduced Jackie Pinkowski as a new trail guide at the May hike, and he is looking to train a couple more guides for the area for the future hikes. Another hike will most likely include a visit to the waterfall built by the Civilian Conservatory Corp. in the 1930s.

Our first major volunteering assignment will be the "Classic Car Show" which is sponsored by our chamber. I wonder how many of you know that they do have a new name. It is because they joined with Homer Glen in forming the "Heritage Corridor Business Alliance". It is nice that both of our communities have been able to join forces.

I don't know if you have ever gone to one of the "Car Shows" but it is a fun time for classic car buffs. Part of Main & Canal is closed off to vehicular traffic and the scene is filled with vintage cars of the past. You can browse at your leisure and either reminisce or wonder how it would be to drive one of these gems down the highway now.

One of the rules, of course, is not to touch the car itself and current car owners are right nearby to make sure you only look.

Our organization has volunteered for this for over ten years. It usually is the same group of people. We guide the vintage car owners in and make sure new vehicles are not entering, etc.

We have been out in the cold with gloves and hats – still making sure our t-shirts are visible or warm weather where bottled water is a must.

People are generally nice and yes, we have had those who argued with us about spots, but all in all a good experience. They announce who the volunteers are from for that night which gives the LAHS publicity.

In one case because two of us were near the train station directing people someone approached us for help. You see he had been distracted and had ended up boarding the wrong train and wasn't quite sure where he was or how his wife could find him to pick him up. She was waiting for him in Naperville and no, she had never been to Lemont. We were able to guide her to Lemont and they were very happy and relieved to finally be reunited. They thanked us profusely.

Last year when others volunteered I wanted to see how many vintage Police cars there were. It was really something as they entered with their sirens blasting. I kept wondering what people thought who did not know it was for the show and not real. Cool! We are always happy to help and it can be fun!

Lemont Area Historical Society Celebrates 50 Golden Years!!!!!

I know for many of us we find it hard to believe that the Lemont Area Historical Society has been preserving our rich history for 50 Years! In the beginning we were a fledging organization held together by people who believed there was something about our town's beginnings, struggles, and triumphs that was important enough to save and to pass along to future generations. This small, but determined group, came together rolled up their sleeves and said, "We can make this happen!".

The Lemont United Methodist Church, where some of our members belonged, was in the process of building a new church with donated land by the Brown family. They wanted to sell this church? – rent it out? – but although attempts were made it seemed like a hopeless situation.


Enter a group of history zealots whose first meeting occurred on April 10, 1970. The minutes state that they had approached the Park District but no federal funds were available. Mrs. Florence Polk reported on her study of the new Lockport Historical Society. Our group was unanimous in its vote to research the proper requirements and ways of setting up an organization. Mr. Regis Mathy suggested all present sign the registry so that an accurate record be kept of the beginning of the Lemont Area Historical Society. Those present were: Sonia Kallick, Florence Polk, Bernice Johnson, Howard Johnson, Harry Swanson, Donald Urick, Regis Mathy, Elaine Mathy, Madeline Hamelen, John J. Zimmer, Gloria Egermier, and Sylvia Savage. I would be remiss if I did not mention the dedication and devotion of Tom Ludwig, who spent countless hours helping our fledging organization besides those already mentioned at the first meeting of our group

On May 5, 1970 the second meeting was held and Mrs. Polk stated the letter was well received from our group by the Lemont United Methodist Church and they had encouraged our organization and hope we could secure sufficient funds. Interesting fact: The land was appraised at \$5,000 and the church at \$5,000 making a total of \$10,000. The heating bill for a year was \$400. This is a list of the committees from the newly created organization: Chicago Historical Society Research; Publicity; Invite LME Church to attend; Information on State Historical Societies; and Ways & Means of Financial Support for the Organization. At the end of this meeting coffee was served.

You know all of this is interesting to those of us who appreciate the determination of those who proceeded us. It has been quite a journey of sacrifice and hard work by countless volunteers to get to this point. You can look at our building, once a recruiting station for the Union Army, now having landmark status; with the white steeple that still graces our limestone building and be reminded we got to this point because people from the past had a vision and mindset to bring us here. They were willing to do whatever it took to make it happen. We owe them a debt of gratitude and to us who have been passed the torch a resolve to preserve our treasured history in this special building we are proud to call "Home" and to instill the same passion to future generations.
